



Presentation

2019 marks the 50th anniversary of the death of Cuban anthropologist Fernando Ortiz Fernandez (1881-1969), one of the most important and influential Latin-American anthropologists due to his researches on the

relationships between the population of African descent and the European colonizers of America. Ortiz is credited with the invention of the term 'Afro-Cuban'. He coined the concept of transculturation to understand colonial processes.

Fernando Ortiz, born in La Havana on July 16, 1881, spent his formative years in Menorca, and conducted his first ethnographic investigations there. The planned workshop aims to explore the roots of his mature theoretical vision from both a Balearic/Mediterranean and Caribbean perspective. Those years of childhood and adolescence of Fernando Ortiz in Menorca are now considered basic for his intellectual development.

This workshop aims to probe the relevance of Ortiz's key concept of 'transculturation' in regards to European national cultural and security projects in an age of massive trans-Mediterranean migration. Centred on this concept, this workshop aims to engineer an unprecedented conversation between Mediterraneanist and Caribbeanist scholars. Its goal is to harness Ortiz's mid-20th century theoretical formulations to early 21st century issues pertinent to both regions, and revolving around issues of migration, territorial sovereignty, and cultural diversity.

It is this perspective that we aim to bring to bear on a dialogue between scholars of the contemporary Caribbean and Mediterranean where, in the latter case, Ortiz's theories hold the promise of enabling novel comparative analytics.

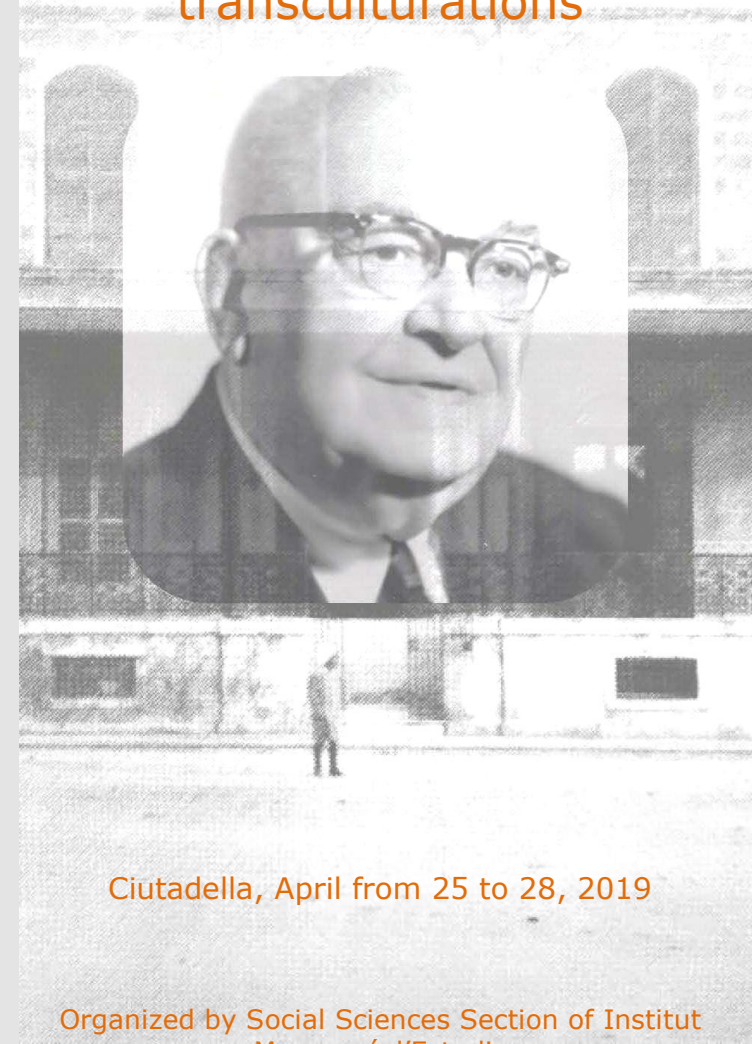
